IAABO has entered into a partnership with the Police Athletic League to conduct an officials' school in cooperation with the PAL National Championships in Lexington, KY, the last week in June. The camps schedule for Coastal Carolina and the University of Rhode Island have been cancelled as each university has cancelled their team camp program. If your goal is to develop as an official and learn the tools of the trade the correct way, the IAABO schools are for you. Anyone who has attended an IAABO school in the past will confirm that each official receives the best in individual attention, and learns the nuances of the rules and recognized mechanics. The camp staff and clinicians embrace some of the most knowledgeable personalities in the profession. They are approachable and never stop talking basketball.

The Directors of the IAABO Officials' School are "Jacky" Loube, IAABO Executive Director, and Peter Webb, IAABO Past President, an active official for over 41 years, and Basketball Commissioner for Maine basketball.

PROGRAM

IAABO Officials' Schools are dedicated to improving the officiating skills of the men and women who enroll. The program will be designed to benefit those who wish to embark upon a career in officiating as well as those who seek refinement of their skills. Classroom sessions will cover all aspects of officiating with lectures, films, workshops and testing. During the afternoons and evenings all officials will officiate games.

Those attending the school will be housed in college dormitories (except Orlando, hotel accommodations), and all meals will be held in college dining halls.

Each official will receive a certificate denoting completion of the course of study provided by the IAABO Officials' School.

Only National Federation Rules and mechanics are taught and used.

STAFF

The staff is made up of veteran scholastic and collegiate officials and interpreters and supervisors who act as observers, utilizing videotape recordings. Leading rules authorities are included among the lecturers and clinicians.

ATTENDEES

Those attending the 28 IAABO Officials' Schools the last seven summers came from 25 States, 4 Canadian Provinces, and 7 countries. Over 2,800 officials have taken advantage of the IAABO schools.



TUITION

The cost per session is \$485. For application and payment received by May 1, 2005, the fee is reduced to \$435 (\$400 for IAABO members). Tuition for the Mount Saint Mary's, Kutztown, and Northeastern camps is \$300. For application and payment received by May 1, 2005, the fee is reduced to \$250 (\$225 for IAABO members).

This all inclusive fee includes: IAABO monogrammed whistle, registration, printed materials, "T" shirt, all meals (Continental breakfast at Disney Camp), lodging, and certificate.

Information as to what to bring and other important information will be sent 1 month prior to each session.
