

# IAABO E-Court

As stated in the June–July *Sportorials*, the National Federation of High Schools Manual Committee changed the foul reporting procedure in a game officiated by a crew of three. Beginning this season, the foul reporting official will take a position tableside after reporting a foul in the designated foul reporting area. This designation was instituted to aid in “more meaningful dialogue and communication” with coaches and the scorer’s table.



## FREE THROW POSITIONS

After leaving the reporting area and arriving at the Trail position tableside, Trail official situates himself/herself at a spot near the division line if multiple free throws are to be administered. This location places the Trail in a better position to recognize and beckon substitutes, as well as communication with the table. Prior to the final free throw or first free throw if the bonus is in effect, the Trail will step down to a position closer to the top of the 3-point line. This enables the Trail to better officiate rebounding activity.

## CENTER OFFICIAL OPPOSITE TABLE CALLS FOUL

After the Center official reports the foul in the foul reporting area, Center takes a position tableside. In the current play, as the foul occurred opposite the table close to the endline, the subsequent throw-in will occur opposite the table side of the court. The foul calling official therefore becomes the Center official tableside.



## LEAD OFFICIAL OPPOSITE TABLE CALLS FOUL

After the Lead official reports the foul in the foul reporting area, Lead takes a position tableside. The Center official tableside replaces the Lead official and becomes the new Lead opposite the table. In the current play, as this foul also occurred opposite the table close to the endline, the subsequent throw-in will also occur opposite the table side of the court. The foul calling official becomes the Center official tableside.
