



NCAA Crew of Three Mechanics

The CCA Manual Committee made changes to the tableside mechanics recently put into practice. These changes were made after the CCA Manual was printed. To avoid confusion and conflicting interpretations circulated from conference to conference and seminar to seminar, please note the following:

For all fouls called in the frontcourt, where the subsequent throw-in will be administered from backcourt to frontcourt, there will be no exchange of position (*slide*) after the calling official reports the foul. It is very easy to adjust to this new mechanic by simply employing the same procedure used for any violation where the resulting throw-in is going opposite (officials merely slide). The illustrated diagrams below clarify this point:

For all fouls called in the frontcourt, where the subsequent throw-in will be administered from backcourt to frontcourt, there will be no exchange of position (*slide*) after the calling official reports the foul. It is very easy to adjust to this new mechanic by simply employing the same procedure used for any violation where the resulting throw-in is going opposite (officials merely slide). The illustrated diagrams below clarify this point:



1. Center official reports foul, slides and becomes new Lead official.
2. Trail official slides and becomes new Center official.
3. Lead official slides, becomes new Trail official and administers throw-in at the closest spot out of bounds to where foul occurred.

1. Trail official reports foul and slides to frontcourt to become new Lead official.
2. Center official slides to become new Center official.
3. Lead official slides to become new Trail official and administers throw-in at the closest spot out of bounds to where foul occurred.



1. Lead official reports foul, returns to throw-in spot and administers throw-in as the new Trail.
2. Trail official slides to frontcourt and becomes new Lead official.
3. Center official slides and remains Center official.
